

Permit required for open burning in Marshall County Violation as Misdemeanor-Liability for Civil Damages. The starting of an open fire within Marshall County by a person or group of person is prohibited unless a permit to do so is first obtained from Marshall County or its designee. An open fire as used in this section is any fire to burn trash, brush, grass, stubble, debris, rubbish or other inflammable material not enclosed in a stove, spark-proof incinerator or an established fireplace approved or constructed by public agencies in designated recreation areas.
