ZONING:

Zoning Director Shannon Lee met with the board to discuss dates of future meetings and to schedule meetings to discuss zoning regulations.

FUTURE MEETINGS:

The Board set the following date for future Commission meetings: March 13 & 27, April 10 & 24.

HIGHWAY:

Dustin Hofland, Highway Superintendent and Sandy Dinger, Highway Secretary met with the board to discuss highway business. Tom Steiner and Larry Heitmann, Eden Township, met with the board to express safety concerns on 438th avenue between 120th and 122nd street. This is a township road that is maintained by the County due to flooding on 120th St, the County road to Hwy 25 has been eroded from the flood years starting in 1997-2012, making it impossible to use, the two miles of 439th were used until 2010 when flooding made it impossible to use making it necessary to start using 438th Ave. The concerns are that the hills on this road are too narrow and steep for the amount of traffic using the road. On two of the hills the ditch is higher than the road, which causes excessive snow drifts. There are also grade raises with steep shoulders that are a safety concern. Heitmann stated that Watertown VoTech has a program in their heavy equipment department where the County may be able to get some assistance. Hofland will check into this. The board will talk with the State's Attorney and discuss options for improving this road and then will arrange a meeting with area residents to discuss these options.

Sandy Dinger presented a change order for BRO 8046(00) 16-3, PCN 05R6. The contracted amount of \$153,901.80 was increased by \$4,196.55 due to additional charges for erosion control/drainage fabric.

The Railroad crossing north of Britton near Horton was discussed. There are safety concerns at this site from numerous individuals. The railroad authority has been contacted along with the State Highway and Railroad Safety Engineer who plans to organize a meeting to discuss a solution to these concerns in the spring.
