HIGHWAY:

Dustin Hofland, Highway Superintendent met with the board and Sandy Dinger, Highway Secretary met with the board via zoom to discuss Highway Department business. Hofland reported that the Highway department has been working on blading roads and hopes the recent rain will help firm up roads. Hofland advised the Bridge Inspections of the County's bridges will start this week. The North end of the Eden Project is done and they are working on

finishing what didn't get done last fall but should be finished in a week or two. The chips seal project will begin with all patching being completed by Bituminous and then remaining funds will be assessed to determine how much of the chip seal to complete. Jones moved, Luttrell seconded to approve a bill submitted by Waverly Township for the Rural Infrastructure Improvement Grant. All members voted aye.

Jones moved, Luttrell seconded to terminate BIG agreement number 717151 effective September 1. 2023. The agreement was entered into on February 27, 2020 for project number BRO 8046(00) 20-1, PCN 07TY, Bridge 46-141-000. The County will reimburse the SD DOT \$15,107.83 for all preliminary engineering expense incurred by the State. All members voted aye.

Medhaug moved, Schuller seconded to approve an approach permit application for TJ and Nicole Stiegelmeier. All members voted aye.

FUEL QUOTES:

Sandy Dinger received the following quotes on May 18, 2023, for #2 dyed Diesel to all three outside shops; Full Circle bid \$3.316 for Veblen's 1,000 gal tank – Eden Oil was the low bid for all three shops (Eden, Langford & Veblen) at \$3.30.

Logan Roehr, EM met with the board to discuss the state LEMP Grant from the State which repays half of the EM salary to the County for meeting specific requirements set out by the state.
