I oppose the draining of large areas, of section 13 and 24 to the north east corner of Newark Township section 24, as there is already a problem there with water going over the township road and flooding my land.

On a natural runoff year such as this one, the water ran over the township town road this spring, and has in the past completely taken out the road on top of the culvert. Pumping hundreds of thousands of gallons of water to an area where there is no holding pond or creek available will certainly take out the road and flood my land and possibly prevent planting on my land and also adjoining sections to the north and east of my property, which are farmed. There is no waterway or creek tributary through my land or any other areas to the east.

In other areas where drainage is performed the water is channeled to a tributary or creek to get rid of it without causing damage to other property.

Dumping a large amount of water with no adequate drainage could create liability issues and I question what the engineering firm is thinking on this project.
