PUBLIC COMMENT:

No one was present to make public comment.

HIGHWAY:

Dustin Hofland, Highway Superintendent met with the board to discuss Highway department business. Hofland stated that he needed to correct his statement from the last meeting. Sisseton Township was the only Township to turn in a 5-year plan for the Rural Access Infrastructure Fund, not Hickman Township as previously stated. Hofland also informed the board that the Highway department has been working on blading and mowing. The Chip Seal project on County Road 16AE is completed. The patching and striping on County Roads is also completed.

Jerry Burger, Stena Township; Wayne Nelson and Neil Foote, Hickman Township; Don Roehr, Lowell Township; and Jay Hagen, Hamilton Township were present for the public 5-year plan meeting. Hofland went through the current plan, explaining that this plan is required by the State in order to apply for Bridge Improvement Grants.

Don Roehr informed Dustin of a bridge that needs some planks replaced in Lowell Township. Hofland said the Bridge inspections have not come back yet, but he will take a look at it. Jay Hagen discussed a bridge that should be inspected. Hofland informed Hagen that the bridge in question is not a County inspected bridge and is the responsibility of the Township. That would be a structure that the Township could apply for a Rural Infrastructure Grant for. Burger asked about County Road 11 asphalt north as he had heard that the State wants to haul on it. Hofland stated that if the State wants to haul on it, they will be required to have a haul road agreement. He has not yet been contacted by the State about it.

Medhaug moved, Jones seconded to approve the Highway Department 5-year plan. All members voted aye.

The following bids were opened and publicly read for the annual supply of propane to all highway shops, the Courthouse, Community Building, and Ambulance Building (price per gallon): Full Circle Ag: Britton, Veblen, Langford-\$1.44, Eden-no bid; Agtegra: All locations \$1.38; Damar Farmers Elevator: Britton, Eden, Langford \$1.25, Veblen-no bid; Economy Propane: All locations \$1.45. Luttrell moved, Knebel seconded to accept the bids from DaMar for the Britton, Eden and Langford locations and from Agtegra for the Veblen location. All members voted aye.

The board authorized Hofland to advertise for bids for the purchase of a payloader to be opened at the next Commissioner meeting. Knebel moved, Medhaug seconded to declare the 2001 New Holland Payloader surplus and offer it for sale at the next Commissioner meeting. All members voted aye.

FUEL QUOTES:

Sandy Dinger received the following quotes for #2 dyed diesel fuel for the Eden, Langford and Veblen shops on September 19: DaMar Elevator \$3.75-Eden & Langford; Eden Oil \$3.72-Eden

No other quotes were available at the time delivery was needed. Gasoline was delivered to the Britton Shop by Eden Oil.

PARAMEDIC:

Nick Fosness and Toni Mattson, Marshall County Healthcare Center and Pam Bard, Marshall County Ambulance met with the board to discuss moving forward with having a paramedic on staff with the Ambulance. Logan Roehr and Lori Amerman were out on a call and were unable to attend, so the group agreed to meet at the next Commissioner Meeting.

Medhaug moved, Jones seconded to enter into executive session to discuss personnel issues at 10:50 am. All member voted aye. The chairman called the board out of executive session at 11:10 am. No action was taken.
