Medhaug moved, Luttrell seconded to accept all bids for magnesium chloride, equipment for bridge construction and repair, equipment for road construction and repair, bituminous mix, gravel and metal pipe, concrete pre-cast, bridge materials. The highway superintendent has the discretion to hire any of the approved bidders taking into consideration location, material, need and availability. All members present voted aye.

Medhaug moved, Luttrell seconded to also use the bid from Beadle County for the year's supply of Metal Pipe and Bridge material. True North Steel (Formerly Huron Culvert & Tank) received the culvert bid as being the lowest bidder and in the best interest of Beadle County. All members present voted aye.

HIGHWAY:

Dustin Hofland, Highway Superintendent met with the board via teleconference. Hofland informed the board that no other solution was found for the Ducks Unlimited wetland mitigation credits bill for the Bridge 46-141-000 for \$69,440. This bill we need to be paid as a part of the requirements of this project. Kilker moved, Luttrell seconded to authorize the chair to sign the proposal for services for Construction Testing & Inspection Services from Foerster Testing for Bridge 46-141-000. All members present voted aye. Hofland reported that he will be meeting with IMEG and Holloway to discuss options for Bridge 46-040-115 to discuss options and potentially getting the bridge "construction ready" which would improve the chances of receiving a BIG grant in the future. He will also talk with IMEG about Bridge 46-030-112 about a hydraulic study to see if culverts would be allowed in that area.

Hofland presented lease options for a 2025 John Deere 772G Motor Grader. Medhaug moved, Luttrell seconded to approve the lease of the motor grader without a v-plow or extended warranty for \$406,304.28 to be paid over 7 years at \$70,733.55 with a \$1 purchase option at the end of the lease. All members present voted aye.

WELFARE:

Linda Haaland, Welfare Director met with the board to present two welfare claims. Medhaug moved, Kilker seconded to approve a welfare claim to Olson Funeral Chapel for \$2,400. All members present voted aye. Kilker moved Luttrell seconded to approve a welfare claim to Olson Funeral Chapel for \$2,000. All members present voted aye.

RESOLUTION:

Kilker moved, Medhaug seconded to approve the following Resolution pending State's Attorney review: Resolution Authorizing the Execution, Terms, Issuance and Payment of General Obligation Bonds, Series 2025, In the Aggregate Principal Amount of Not to Exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) of Marshall County, South Dakota. The resolution in its entirety can be viewed in the Auditor's office during regular business hours. All members present voted aye.

INMATE HOUSING:

Kilker moved, Luttrell seconded to authorize the chair to sign an inmate housing agreement with Day County to pay \$75 per day for unsentenced inmates and \$50 per day for sentenced inmates. All members present voted aye.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Medhaug moved, Luttrell seconded to enter into executive session to discuss personnel issues pursuant to SDCL 1-25-2 at 11:32 am. All members present voted aye. The Chairman called the board out of executive session at 11:54 am. No action was taken.

FUTURE MEETINGS:

The board set the following dates for future Commission meetings: April 8 & 22, May 6 & 20, June 3 & 17.

PERFORMANCE BOND:

Kilker moved, Luttrell seconded to approve Performance and Payment Bonds for Comstock Construction pending State's Attorney review. All members present voted aye.

ADMISSION OF SERVICE:

Medhaug moved, Kilker seconded to authorize the chair to sign an admission of service on a legal notice that the County has a taxing interest in. All members present voted aye.
